entries close Tuesday 9th July.

(WCOC reserve the right to retain part or all of the entry fee if the event has to

be cancelled.)

EOD: There **may** be LIMITED entry on the day, subject to map availability. (Don't

take a chance – pre-enter at SIEntries.)

Cost: Senior - £10, Junior - £6 (£2 discount for BOF members). There will be a

supplement of £2 for EOD, and this is subject to maps being available.

Map: All courses will receive a pre-marked map (A3 at 1:12,500) printed on

waterproof paper, and use SI punching (SI card hire available for £1, £40

charge if lost).

Parking: At High Row – GR NY380219. £2 parking fee per car.

Starts: from 10 -11:00am (go when you're ready). Start and finish are 5 minutes walk

from assembly and parking. Please note – all courses will close at 2pm.

Safety: Please come prepared to carry equipment, food and drink appropriate to the

weather conditions on the day.

All competitors must carry whistle and compass.

Shorts may be worn, but come prepared for more inclement weather, as the

organiser may make leg cover mandatory on the day.

A mobile phone is recommended but not mandatory.

There will be kit checks.

You must report and download your SI card when you finish or if you retire, so

we have an electronic record as well as a manual record.

All competitors are reminded that if another competitor is injured or in

difficulty they must stop and offer assistance - this is more important than your

result.

Routegadget, WinSplits and Splitsbrowser.
